



Beware of New Year Scams: Senior Medicare Patrol News

Hello all! 2026 is getting underway and that means scammers will be busy trying to sell the unsuspecting on everything from free genetic testing to saying there is a new Medicare Card and they'll be glad to send you one if you will just tell them your Medicare number and other personal information.

There have been reports of fake Medicare card scams in the southern part of Alabama.

Remember, there is no such thing as a free genetic test. The only person who can order a genetic test that Medicare will pay for is your healthcare provider, not a so-called provider over the phone.

Remember: there is no new Medicare Card. Do NOT give out your card number unless you are certain you are giving it to a trustworthy provider.
